

Make sure the balloon says phase 4.




Answer yes or no to the following questions: You need to read them, then thumbs up or down!

Today we are practicing reading high frequency words.

Todays task...

(The HFW glash cards are gound on the phonics home learning page)



- Display a word card from the set.
- Sound the word out like a robot E.g. ch-i-l-d-r-e-n = children
- ullet Say a sentence using the word E.g The children played in the park.
- Repeat with each word card (there are 20 in total, so you may want to do 10 today and 10 another time)
- Start again with the first word card and repeat the process more quickly without giving a sentence.
- Work through all cards.
- Go through cards a final time with your child saying the word without sounding them out.


Answer yes or no to the following questions: You need to read them, then thumbs up or down!

Wednesday

Lets warm up...



Today, we are learning to spell words with adjacent consonants.

Here are the adjacent consonants that will appear in the words:



Now you are going to play phoneme fingers!

• Please print off or draw a phoneme frame:

(a printable version is saved on the phonics home learning tab)

• This is how to play:

Have four, five and six phoneme frames available. Say a word e.g. think and model counting out phonemes on your fingers.

Ask your child how to write each of the phonemes (sounds)

Count them off against your fingers to check that you haven't forgotten any.

Write the word in the phoneme frame.

Now, adult reads word.

Children show the number of phonemes by holding up that number of fingers then try writing the word.


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The words for this task are on the following page...



Now, listen carefully to your grown up! Grown ups — please do the following:

Write the word 'my'

Check that your child can read it.

Say a sentence using the word. E.g. I love my mummy!

Soundtalk the word, raising a finger for each phoneme.

Ask your child to do the same.

Discuss the letters required for each phoneme, using letter names.

Ask your child to trace the shapes of the letters with their fingers.

Rub the word out or hide it then ask your child to write the word on their own.

Repeat with 2 more words: 'all' and 'her'



Now read the following sentences:

- •My damp tent smells as bad as a mad skunk.
- •Do all brown toads grunt and groan?
- •My chimp had a sandwich for her lunch.



Friday

Lets warm up...

Can you spot the adjacent consonants sk, st, and mp words in this story?

Mark had to make a mask. He went to the shed and put the lamp on. On the bench there was some card.

"I had better start my mask," said Mark.

He put some tusks and a trunk on his mask. It was a big task. He got his flask and had a drink. Then he painted the mask and stuck on some ears.

"It is the best mask," he said. Next, I will make a chimp.
