
Each week, you will follow a similar routine:

Monday — Introduce the new rule and find out your new spelling words


Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday — Activities and games to practice the new rule. You also have an 'assignment' on spelling shed to complete too!

Words that start with the phoneme /n/ are sometimes spelt with the digraph 'kn'.

Watch out! Very occasionally, the /n/ sound at the start of a word can also be spelt with 'gn'.



gnome

**kn**ock - to hit something to make a noise



**kn**ow - to have information in your mind



**kn**ee - the middle part of your leg that lets it bend



**kn**itting - making something with 2 long needles and wool




**kn**ife - a sharp tool used for cutting up food





gnaw - to chew and bite something over and over again.




gnash - to bring your teeth together quickly, often when you are angry.

gnarled - twisted and rough - like an old tree trunk.






